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Why School ?: How Education Must Change by Will Richardson, a former public school teacher, offers some thought provoking ideas about the concept of "school." Richardson asks for a reexamination of the traditional concept of "school" as a confined space with one teacher delivering information to one without walls where the student discovers information for himself from a variety of sources by using technology. He points out "school is the only place in their lives where they can't use the technology they carry around in their pockets and backpacks to answer questions." Richardson's concept is that while once the library was the scholar's best source of information, today's students can locate more useable information on Google and much faster.
