Mentoring a Must

I believe in maintaining good health to enjoy all that life brings, but "good health" too often focuses on our physical condition, ignoring the importance of mental health. The taboo of discussing one's mental health is a inheritance that harms us all, and it may be one of the biggest factors in teacher turnover.

Who doesn't remember their early years of teaching, suffering through times of self-doubt while wondering alone—at the end of the day "am I doing it right?", "why won't the students listen to me?", and "is this what it's supposed to feel like to be a teacher?" Sources from the Mayo Clinic to Sonia the psychic agree an antidote to the depressive episodes caused by the stress of work life is having a friend.

Maintaining supportive relationships is a key to sound mental health. Whether it is a friend, religious leader, peer, counselor or mentor, having someone to listen without criticizing is integral to one's ability to cope with whatever comes. And isn't that what Delta Kappa Gamma is all about? My monthly Eta Delta meeting always lifts me up.

Did you have a trusted listener when you were a novice teacher? Are you *now* that important friend to a young educator now?

Recently, I received a Friday afternoon email: "can I call you after school today please? I need to talk. . . " Twenty minutes spent just listening—no criticism or advice—may give a young professional the emotional support she needs to stay in our honorable profession.

Women in Texas: "Texas's Foremost Woman Educator Annie Webb Blanton" Ann Fears Crawford Crystal Sasse Ragsdale

Legend has it that Davy Crockett had a saying—"Be sure you're right, then go ahead."

Women who make history books share several characteristics—they do what they believe to be the right thing and they have the courage of their convictions to do it their own way.

First published in 1982, then revised and expanded in 1992, *Women in Texas* by Ann Fears Crawford and Crystal Sasse Ragsdale is a collection of biographies of outstanding women who have shaped Texas politics, sports, education, arts, and business, from Jane Long, the mother of Texas, to Ann Richards, governor (at that time) of Texas. Embedded in the long list of luminaries is **Dr. Anne Webb Blanton**, the founder of Delta Kappa Gamma, a professional society of women educators, that set out to "combat the discrimination that existed toward women in the educational field by endowing scholarships to aid outstanding women leaders in pursuing graduate study." (One thing that would make Dr. Annie Webb Blanton cringe is the authors' use of the word "sorority" to describe DKG!)

As the first woman president of the Texas State Teachers Association (TSTA), Dr. Blanton worked "to establish both a permanent fund for the organization and a retirement fund." As state superintendent of schools, Dr. Blanton initiated, supported, and advocated changes to improve conditions in education by improving rural schools, and "raising the scholastic and professional requirements of teachers."

She was well ahead of her time in her views regarding educational excellence for students and teachers. As the woman "who had opened the doors of educational opportunities," Dr. Blanton was declared "Texas's foremost woman education of the early twentieth century" and "a woman whom time will call great."

Out of office, Dr. Blanton kept education issues before the legislators. She knew true change had to have the strength of the law, so she "actively pushed for progressive legislation, many times writing the bills herself, and then lobbying for their passage through the legislature."

Today, being informed and supporting legislation is just as important. Dr. Blanton's legacy is ours to protect and expand.
