The flooding associated with Hurricane Harvey led to the damage or destruction of roughly 1/3 of all housing in Houston. You read correctly -1/3. Approximately 311,000 households.

Three months afterward, thousands of Houstonians remain homeless – living with friends, neighbors or relatives; sometimes in tents, hotels, or structures not fit for habitation.

This is often called the season of giving but the overwhelming need this year can simply overwhelm. When it does, try reminding yourself that no one person, organization or agency can address all the needs. This is truly a situation where it will take a village.

This year, more than ever, do what you can. Give one item more than usual to the food bank. Donate a coat or jacket from your closet to the coat drive. Pluck an Angel from a mall tree and grant someone's wish. If you have limited financial resources but are physically capable, help cleanup – the amount trash remaining is almost unimaginable. If none of that is possible, smile at a stranger, open a door, or simply lend an ear to someone who is struggling.
