## Reading Rocks!

Eta Delta Cares and Shares



March 6, 2013, members of Eta Delta demonstrated acts of kindness, caring, and service by reading to classes at Bane Elementary School in Cy-Fair ISD. Bane Elementary is in a most-at-risk-community of mostly non-English speaking students. When Virginia Marez arrived as principal, she knew she had to tackle the issues plaguing her school head-on. As a result, Bane Elementary has been rated recently as both recognized and exemplary. Ms Marez created an environment where students now love learning.

In celebration of the successes of literacy and to reinforce the value of reading, Ms Marez accepted the offer of having members of DKG read to various classes. Nancy Malone read *Three Billy Goats Gruff* and *Can I Have a Stegosaurus, Mom? Can I? Please?* to two different classes of second graders. "The children were attentive and they really got into these favorites that never get old. Reading to them was really a great experience," Malone said. Debbie McCart agreed that she enjoyed reading *Goldilocks* and *Three Little Pigs* to two different first grade classes.

Two second grade classes heard Debbie Brand read one of her own favorites, *Where the Sidewalk Ends* by Shel Silverstein. The children's captivation with the rhythm, rhyme and humor in poetry was delightful! "I'm ready to go back!" she exclaimed.

Jane Flinn who coordinated the read-in at Bane, enjoyed reading the *Cat Sang Flat* to the Life Skills class and *Ping* to a fourth grade class.

The school librarian pre-selected the books so that the volunteers could go straight to the classes. Teachers also received a treat; Eta Delta provided two sheet cakes for the staff lounge. Ms Marez expressed appreciation for giving her students a wonderful experience of having guest teachers for the day.



# Literacy Leads Learning
